


# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

## Madison, Illinois



### Number of farms

1,152 farms in 2002, 1,327 farms in 1997, down 13 percent.

### Land in farms

295,677 acres in 2002, 290,225 acres in 1997, up 2 percent.

257 acres in 2002, 219 acres in 1997, up 17 percent.

### Market Value of Production

\$78,196,000 in 2002, \$86,826,000 in 1997, down 10 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$65,186,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$13,009,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm



\$67,878 in 2002, \$65,431 in 1997, up 4 percent.
