




# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

\$49,129,000 in 2002, \$53,571,000 in 1997, down 8 percent.

Livestock sales accounted for \$24,206,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm



\$44,582 in 2002, \$47,492 in 1997, down 6 percent.
