




# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

282 acres in 2002, 253 acres in 1997, up 11 percent.

### Market Value of Production

\$17,559,000 in 2002, \$16,092,000 in 1997, up 9 percent.

Crop sales accounted for \$2,119,000 of the total value in 2002.

Livestock sales accounted for \$15,440,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm



\$18,601 in 2002, \$15,886 in 1997, up 17 percent.
