




### Pender County - North Carolina Farms with Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino Operators Compared with All Farms







### Pender County - North Carolina Farms with Asian Operators Compared with All Farms



### Pender County - North Carolina Farms with Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander Operators Compared with All Farms





